Updating your antivirus software frequently will go a long way toward preventing an infection. Don't assume that your antivirus software is up to date, periodically check to make sure that it is.

- Do not open attachments from unknown sources – as silly as it sounds, one of the most common ways that viruses get spread is through attachments. Often times the attachment will have some text with it that leads you to believe that it is genuine – a good rule of thumb: If it looks funny chances are, it is!
- Don't visit strange websites – ISPs and search engines are doing better these days at identifying sites that are phishing sites or hosting viruses, but again an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.
- Avoid social networking traps – limit the links that you visit from social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter. If prompted, do not install applications on these sites unless you are certain that they are clean.
- Backup your data frequently – in the event that you do get a virus, this move can be a lifesaver. Frequent backups can get you back up and running with minimal disruption.
